Draft Minutes of 80th Project Approval Board (PAB) Meeting held on
22-11-2013 to discuss the financial proposal of West Bengal under
Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS)

The 80th PAB meeting was held through video-conferencing under the Chairpersonship of Additional Secretary, Ministry of Women & Child Development on 22-11-2013 to discuss the financial proposal of West Bengal for release of grants under ICPS for 2013-14. The list of officials who attended the PAB meeting is annexed.

2. At the outset, Chairperson, PAB welcomed the officials present and requested the, Secretary, Social Welfare Department, Govt. of West Bengal to present the situation of children covered under ICPS in the State along with the financial proposal of the State for release of grants under ICPS for 2013-14. The State was informed that their financial proposal needs clarifications which were intimated to the State Government. The status of various interventions under ICPS was presented by the State Government with respect to the Scheme.

3. The financial grant under ICPS is released under the following heads:

- i) Service Delivery Structures [*State Project Support Unit (SPSU), State Child Protection Society (SCPS), State Adoption Resource Agency (SARA) and District Child Protection Unit (DCPU)*]
- ii) Statutory Support Services [*Child Welfare Committee (CWC) and Juvenile Justice Board (JJB)*]
- iii) Care Support and Rehabilitation Services [*Institutional Care (Government and NGO-run homes/ Child Care Institutions, Non- institutional Care and Open Shelters)*]

4. **Service Delivery Structures**

As per ICPS norms, for service delivery structures grant is released in the ratio of 75:25 for state structures other than SPSU for which it is released 100% by centre.

The State in its proposal has requested grant for full financial year including staff salary component. In SCPS only 5 posts out of 13 have been filled-up, in SARA 3 positions are filled out of 5 have been filled up and in DCPUs only 103 positions out of 228 positions are filled up. The State informed that the rest of the Staff in all the structures will be

appointed by 1st December, 2013 as they have already advertised for the posts.

The State also informed that due to lower salaries under ICPS people leave when they get a job with better salaries.

4.2 For SPSU, the State in its proposal has requested recurring grant for complete year including staff salary component.

PAB approved recurring grant for full financial year 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.

4.3 For SCPS, the State in its proposal has requested recurring grant for complete year including staff salary component.

PAB approved recurring grant for full financial year 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.

State has requested one-time grant for Innovative Project component under SCPS, details for which have not been provided by the State.

PAB accorded in-principle approval to the State subject to State submitting a detailed proposal for Innovative Project.

4.4 For SARA, the State in its proposal has requested recurring grant for complete year including staff salary component.

PAB approved recurring grant for full financial year 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.

4.6 For DCPUs, the State in its proposal has requested recurring grant for complete year including staff salary component. The State has requested the rent for only 4 DCPUs for complete year.

PAB approved recurring grant for full financial year for all 19 DCPUs in 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment and rent component for only 4 DCPUs for full financial year as requested by State, as per ICPS norms.

PAB also approved recurring grant for district Sponsorship and After care programme

for all 19 DCPUs.

5. Statutory Support Services

The State informed that CWCs and JJBs have been constituted and their members trained in all the 19 districts. The State has requested salary for assistant-cum-data Entry Operator for full financial year in all 19 CWCs and JJBs; however, the date of appointment has been provided for only 14 CWCs and 11 JJBs. The State informed that all the CWCs and JJBs have been provided with necessary furniture and equipment and that number of CWC sittings is 3 per week and 5 per week for the JJBs, however, according to the details the number of CWC sittings varied from 4 to 8 per month. The State informed that they would submit a revised proposal with correct information. PAB inquired about the number of cases pending at the CWCs and at the JJBs as the State was not submitting the Monitoring reports. The State government requested again for the user ID and password which was already provided to them for submitting monitoring formats.

5.2 PAB approved recurring grant for all CWCs and JJBs for the complete financial year based on the actual number of sittings and the number of members appointed except the salary of assistant cum data entry operators, which was approved from the date of appointment provided by the State, as per the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

6. Care, Support and Rehabilitation Services

6.1. Institutional Care

6.1.1 Government Homes

The State has requested recurring grants for 62 Government run Homes, however the details have been provided for only 18 Homes. The State informed that the number of Homes is only 18 but since the capacity of the Homes is more than 50, hence, they have arrived at figure of 62 Homes by dividing the capacity of Homes by 50 and thus has requested grant for 62 homes. PAB informed the State they could request the grant for Homes as per the capacity. The State informed that they would submit a revised proposal with correct information.

PAB approved recurring grant for the existing 18 Homes as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

The State has requested non-recurring and up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for 5 Homes, however, the PWD estimates have been provided for 3 Homes.

PAB approved non-recurring grants for 5 Homes and up-gradation (non-recurring) grants for only 3 Homes.

PAB accorded in-principle approval for up-gradation (non-recurring) for the other 2 Homes to be provided when the State submits PWD estimates.

The State has requested grant for construction of new buildings of 2 existing homes for 100 children each. However, the State has not provided PWD estimate and land availability for construction of new building.

PAB accorded in principle approval for 4 units of 50 children each, 2 for Malda and 2 for Bardhaman. The State informed that the grant provided for construction as per ICPS norms is very low and the amount as per PWD estimates is very high. The State requested to provide more grant in order to ensure better quality. PAB directed that sanction of grant for construction may be limited to 25% above the norms under ICPS in view of the aforementioned reasons and as also done in 2012-13 in case of Andhra Pradesh. Any additional requirement may be met from the State's own resources such as MP/MLA funds.

6.1.2 NGO run Homes

The State has provided details for 28 Homes, however, the State has requested grant for 54 Homes. The State informed that the number of Homes is only 28 but since the capacity of the Homes is more than 50, hence, they have arrived at figure of 54 Homes by dividing the capacity of Homes by 50 and thus has requested grant for 54 homes. PAB informed the State they could request the grant for Homes as per the capacity. The State informed that they would submit a revised proposal with correct information.

PAB approved recurring grant for the existing 28 Homes as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

The State has proposed 15 new NGO run Homes. Out of these, four (4) are exclusive Homes for children with special needs. The State has requested grant for all the Homes including grant for Specialized Units for Children with Special Needs for the four Homes.

PAB approved grant for the 15 additional Homes from the date of sanction.

The State has requested non-recurring and up-gradation grant for 1 Home and has also provided the PWD estimates for the same.

PAB approved up-gradation (non-recurring) grants for 1 Home (Pravartak Seva Niketan, Hoogly).

The State has also requested grant for 34 Specialised Unit for children with special needs, however, the details regarding whether they are Government run or NGO run and the actual number of beneficiaries has not been provided. The State informed during PAB meeting that the actual number of Specialised Unit for children with special needs are 4 Government run and 13 NGO run and they would submit a revised proposal with correct information.

PAB approved recurring grant for the existing Specialised Unit for children with special needs as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

6.2 Non Institutional Care

Representative from CARA informed the PAB that there is no RIPA in North Bengal and requested the State to form a RIPA in there, as it is border area. The State informed that all the RIPAs are located near Kolkata, however, they will designate one SAA in North Bengal namely North Bengal People's Development Association, as RIPA.

6.2.1 NGO run SAAs

The State has requested recurring grants for full financial year for existing 16 run SAAs, which were supported under ICPS during 2012-13 and 10 additional SAAs. PAB observed that the State has not requested grant for ten SAAs as per actual number of beneficiaries and the State was requested revised proposal for recurring grant for each SAA based on the actual number of beneficiaries rather than for only 10 Children as requested by the State

PAB approved recurring grants for the 16 existing SAAs for complete financial year 2013-14 as requested by State and for the 10 additional SAAs the recurring and non-recurring grant were approved from the date of sanction, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

6.3 Open Shelters

The State has requested recurring grant for 21 existing Open shelters and non-recurring and recurring grant for 9 additional Open Shelters for full financial year 2013-14. The State has informed that the NGOs and location of these 9 additional Open Shelters have been identified.

PAB approved recurring grant for 21 existing Open Shelters for full financial year 2013-14. PAB also approved the recurring and non-recurring grant for 9 additional open shelters from the date of sanction.

7. Other Items

7.1 Balance/Unspent Amount

The State has submitted the Statement of Expenditure for 2012-13. The unspent expenditure as per the Statement of Expenditure is Rs. 1.17 lakhs. The same will be adjusted while releasing grant for 2013-14.

7.2 TrackChild

There are 64 Child Care Institutions funded under ICPS. However, only 37 are uploading data on TrackChild. There are 19 CWCs and JJBs, however, only 6 are entering information /orders on TrackChild software.

PAB requested the State government to look into this matter and upload the data expeditiously.

8. Decisions And Approvals Granted By PAB: The following decisions were taken and approvals granted by the PAB:

8.1 Service Delivery Structures

- i) Recurring grant was approved for SPSU for full financial year 2013-14, except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.
- ii) Recurring grant was approved for SCPS for full financial year 2013-14, except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.

In-principle approval was accorded for grant-in-aid for supporting Innovative project in the State under SCPS, to be released after the State submits detailed proposal.

- iii) Recurring grant was approved for SARA for full financial year 2013-14, except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment, as per ICPS norms.
- iv) Recurring grant was approved all 19 DCPUs for full financial year 2013-14 except salary of staff which was approved from the date of their appointment and rent component for only 4 DCPUs for 12 months as requested by State, as per ICPS norms.

Sponsorship and Aftercare Grant was approved for all 19 districts for full financial year as requested by the State.

8.2 Statutory Support Services

- i) Recurring grant was approved for all 19 CWCs and JJBs for the complete financial year based on the actual number of sittings and the number of members appointed, except the salary of assistant-cum-data Entry Operator, which was approved from the date of appointment provided by the State, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State.

8.3 Institutional Care

8.3.1 Government run Homes

- i) Recurring grant was approved for existing 18 Govt. run Homes, grant for which was released during 2012-13, as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. (List A attached)
- ii) Non-recurring grant was approved for 5 Homes and up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for only 3 Homes. In-principle approval was accorded for up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for the other 2 Homes to be provided when the State submits PWD estimates. (List B attached)
- iii) In-principle approval was accorded for construction grant (non-recurring) for 4 units of 50 children each, 2 for Malda and 2 for Bardhaman after the State submits PWD

estimates, PAB approved non-recurring grant for construction to a limit of 25% above of the norms under ICPS.

- iv) Recurring grant was approved for 4 Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children which were supported last year for full financial year as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. **(List C attached)**

8.3.2 NGO run Homes

- i) PAB approved recurring grant to existing 28 NGO run Homes for which grant was released during 2012-13 as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. **(List D attached)**
- ii) PAB approved recurring grant for 15 additional Homes including grant for Specialized Units for Children with Special Needs for 4 Homes. **(List E attached)**
- iii) PAB approved up-gradation (non-recurring) grant for 1 Home (Pravartak Seva Niketan, Hoogly) as the State has submitted PWD estimates.
- iv) PAB approved grant for 13 Specialised Unit in Children's Home for Special Needs Children which were supported last year for full financial year as per actual number of beneficiaries for full financial year, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. **(List F attached)**

8.4 Non- Institutional Care

8.4.1 NGO run SAA

- i) PAB approved recurring grants for the 16 existing SAAs for complete financial year 2013-14 as requested by State. **(List G attached)**
- ii) PAB also approved recurring and non-recurring grant for 10 additional SAAs from the date of sanction, according to the revised proposal to be submitted by the State. **(List H attached)**

8.5 Open Shelters

- i) PAB approved recurring grant for 21 existing for full financial year 2013-14. (List I attached)
- ii) PAB also approved the recurring and non-recurring grants for additional 9 open shelters from the date of sanction. (List J attached)
